



**Academic Standards of Progress
Approved August 1992**

Minimum Satisfactory Grade Level

A student will be considered on academic probation if he or she fails to maintain the cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) required for good standing as follows:

<u>Semester Hours Earned at DACC</u>	<u>Minimum GPA for Good Standing</u>
0 – 17 credit hours	1.40
18 – 31 credit hours	1.60
32 – 48 credit hours	1.80
49+	2.00

Academic Probation

A student placed on academic probation will be limited to a maximum of twelve (12) credit hours of enrollment for the next term. The following criteria also apply:

1. The student must earn a 2.00 GPA or higher for the term.
2. The student will remain on probation until he or she attains a cumulative GPA for good standing. (See the above table.)

In the event that the student does not achieve either of the above criteria, the student will be placed on academic suspension for one term.

Readmission

Before a suspended student will be readmitted he or she must prepare a Probation Contract that will identify the measures to be applied to improve the student’s GPA (e.g., change of program, remedial classes, tutoring or other academic support service, etc.). Enrollment for the next semester will be limited to a maximum of eleven (11) credit hours. The student must earn a 2.00 grade point average (GPA) or higher for the term. The student will remain on probation until he or she attains a cumulative GPA for good standings as noted in the table above. In the event that the student does not achieve either of the above-mentioned criteria, the student will be placed on academic suspension for one term.

Appeals

Appeals of Academic Suspension may be directed to the Director of Enrollment Services/Registrar.
