## **ADMISSION CRITERIA TO THE TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAM**

*(Admission to the University does not guarantee admission into the Teacher Education Program.)*

1. Submit a formal application for University admission to Teacher Education program.
2. As of June 30, 2019, the Test of Basic Skills is no longer required to obtain an educator licensure. This includes the SAT and ACT exams. For more information, visit <https://www.isbe.net/Documents/SB1952-Test-of-basic-skills.pdf>. Students will still need to pass the edTPA and content tests in the relevant subject and grade they intend to teach.
3. A 2.75 (4.0 scale) cumulative GPA based on all work attempted at EIU and maintain a minimum 2.75 GPA in the Teacher Education program.

### **Notes:**

1. The History with Teacher Certification option is for student who would like to major in History and gain Illinois Certification at the secondary level to teach all of the social sciences (history, economics, geography, political science, psychology, and sociology/anthropology). Students must receive a grade of C or higher in all courses that apply to the major, and must maintain a major GPA of 3.0 or higher and a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher to complete the program.
2. At EIU, all students must have completed a foreign language in either high school or college. This requirement may be met by completing two years of a single foreign language in high school with a C or better, or two semesters of a single foreign language in college. If this requirement has been met, students should take POLI 150 or SOCY 100, which are required for EIU. These courses are not electives; they are requirements for the program.
3. PHYS114 Physical Geology is the preferred Physical Science course for History major.
