## **Transfer Admission Requirements:**

1. 2.0 Grade Point Average (4.0 scale).

## **Admission to the Teacher Education Program:**

Students are eligible to make formal application to the program with:

1. An overall GPA of at least 2.75 (4.0 scale).
2. Completion of ENGL 101 and ENGL 102 with a grade of C or better.
3. As of June 30, 2019, the Test of Basic Skills is no longer required to obtain an educator licensure. This includes the SAT and ACT exams. Students will still need to pass the edTPA and content tests in the relevant subject and grade they intend to teach

Please note that transfer students planning to complete the Teacher Certification program are encouraged to contact the College of Education and Human Services, Student Services Office at least one semester prior to enrolling at SIUC.

## **NOTES:**

1. SIU's College of LAS requires foreign language at the second semester college level. This is equivalent to two years of one foreign language in high school, but SIU requires that a proficiency test be passed if two semesters are not completed at college level. Students should take a social science elective if this has been met.
2. All teacher certification majors are required to complete a three-hour course in Third World or NonWestern Culture, either in Humanities or Social Science. Choose from HIST 141, HIST 142, LITR 111, LITR 121, LITR 122, or PHIL 104.
3. Teacher Education majors should take the following electives: EDUC 270 Educational Psychology and HLTH 101 Contemporary Health.
4. Secondary Teaching Certificate in Social Science with a History Designation: Students pursuing teaching certificate must complete five additional courses from the Social Science disciplines of economics, geography, political science, or sociology. (GEOG 134, CECN 102, POLI 238, POLI 231.) One of the five courses must include GEOG 300, which is offered and taken at Southern.
