Transfer Admission Requirements:

1. 3.10 Grade Point Average (4.0 scale).
2. Sixty (60) semester hours of credit.
3. The Online Application is required, but it is strongly encouraged to check deadlines often. Your application will be processed more quickly and you will be able to check its status online.

To become a licensed/certified teacher in the State of Illinois, an individual must pass at least three state exams:

1. As of June 30, 2019, the Test of Basic Skills is no longer required to obtain an educator licensure. This includes the SAT and ACT exams. Students will still need to pass the edTPA and content tests in the relevant subject and grade they intend to teach.

NOTES:

1. Area of concentration electives should all be chosen from the same department: history, sociology, art, etc. (Nine (9) additional hours will be required at the University of Illinois. A total of 18 hours is needed.)
2. After receiving an Early Childhood Education degree and after teaching for three months in the field, students can apply for state certification in Early Childhood Education.
3. Early Childhood majors will be required to take an additional English composition class at the University of Illinois.
4. All teacher certification majors are required to take a three (3) hour course in Third World or Non-Western Culture, either in Humanities or Social Science. Recommended courses are LITR 111, MUSI 126, or GEOG 134.
5. As of Fall 2000, transfer students must have completed the third year level of high school or third semester of college foreign language. If foreign language requirement has been met, students may choose an elective course such as EDUC 101, EDUC 270, PSYC 101, ANTH 107, or CECN 102.
6. A criminal background check (including finger printing) is conducted for various parts of the curricula. Certain convictions may bar employment. All convictions are reviewed. Failure to consent to the criminal background check will result in a student not being able to complete a public school certification program, and in the cancellation of any admission to the program. For further information, contact the Council on Teacher Education at 217-333-2804.
7. Elementary Education students are encouraged to complete College Algebra and Statistics criteria prior to transferring. Statistics requirement can be met with MATH 115 or MATH 161. College Algebra requirement can be met with MATH 111 at DACC; with an ACT score of 25+/SAT score of 570+; by completing College Algebra, Pre-calculus, or Calculus with a C+ in high school. Elementary Education students are encouraged to take MATH 118 and MATH 119 at DACC, as they are UIUC requirements.
8. Early childhood students are required to take a third science course. This can be fulfilled by taking PHYS 114 or PHYS 143 at DACC.
